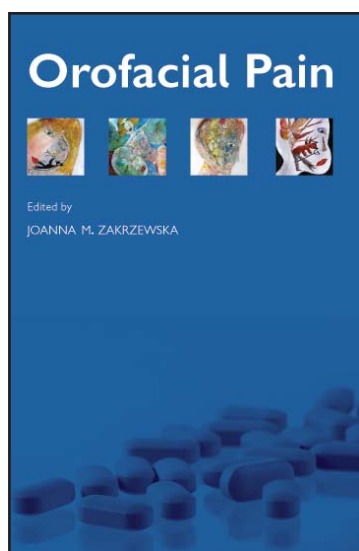

A recent epidemiological study of prevalence of orofacial pain in the community in the UK identified that 7% of the population had chronic orofacial pain—pain lasting over 3 months in the mouth or face, excluding headaches. Management of orofacial pain falls between dentists and doctors and both have radically different approaches which means patients treatment is often dependent on the healthcare professional they see.

Management of orofacial pain has improved dramatically over the years and it is now essential that dentists and general medical practitioners are aware of these advances and can manage these cases themselves. This book takes an evidence based psychosocial approach to the management of orofacial pain patients and provide basic guidelines so that a wide range of healthcare workers would feel able to manage these patients and able to refer to a text quickly in the clinical setting.
