Voting at the Meeting

1. In accordance with paragraph 10(6)(b) of the existing constitution of TNA UK, resolutions put to the vote at the Meeting shall be decided on a show of hands. Every member attending the Meeting has one vote. In the event of an equality of votes, the chair of the Meeting shall have a second, or casting, vote. The existing constitution of TNA UK does not permit voting by proxy.
2. An organisation or corporate body that is a member of TNA UK may, in accordance with its usual decision-making process, authorise a person to act as its representative at the Meeting. The representative is entitled to exercise the same powers on behalf of the organisation or corporate body as it could exercise as an individual member.
